For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God.



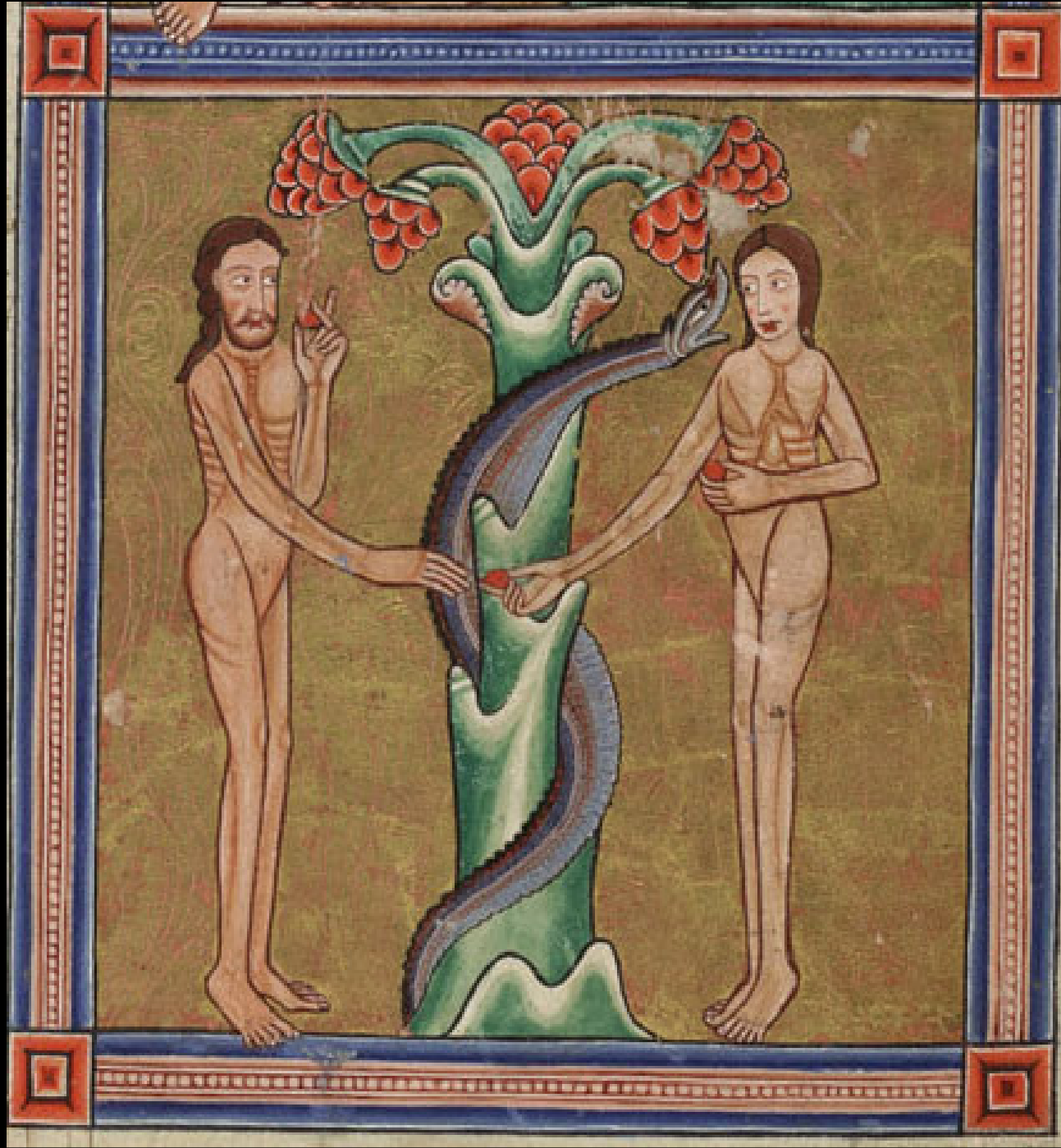

Isaiah 53:10 Yet it pleased the Lord to bruise Him; He has put *Him* to grief. When you make His soul an offering for sin, ... and the pleasure of the Lord shall prosper in His hand.

Genesis 3:15

“And I (God the Father) will put enmity between you (Satan) and the woman (Eve), and between your seed (the unsaved) and her Seed (Christ); He shall bruise your head (a mortal lasting wound upon Satan), and you shall bruise His heel (the temporary death of Christ).”

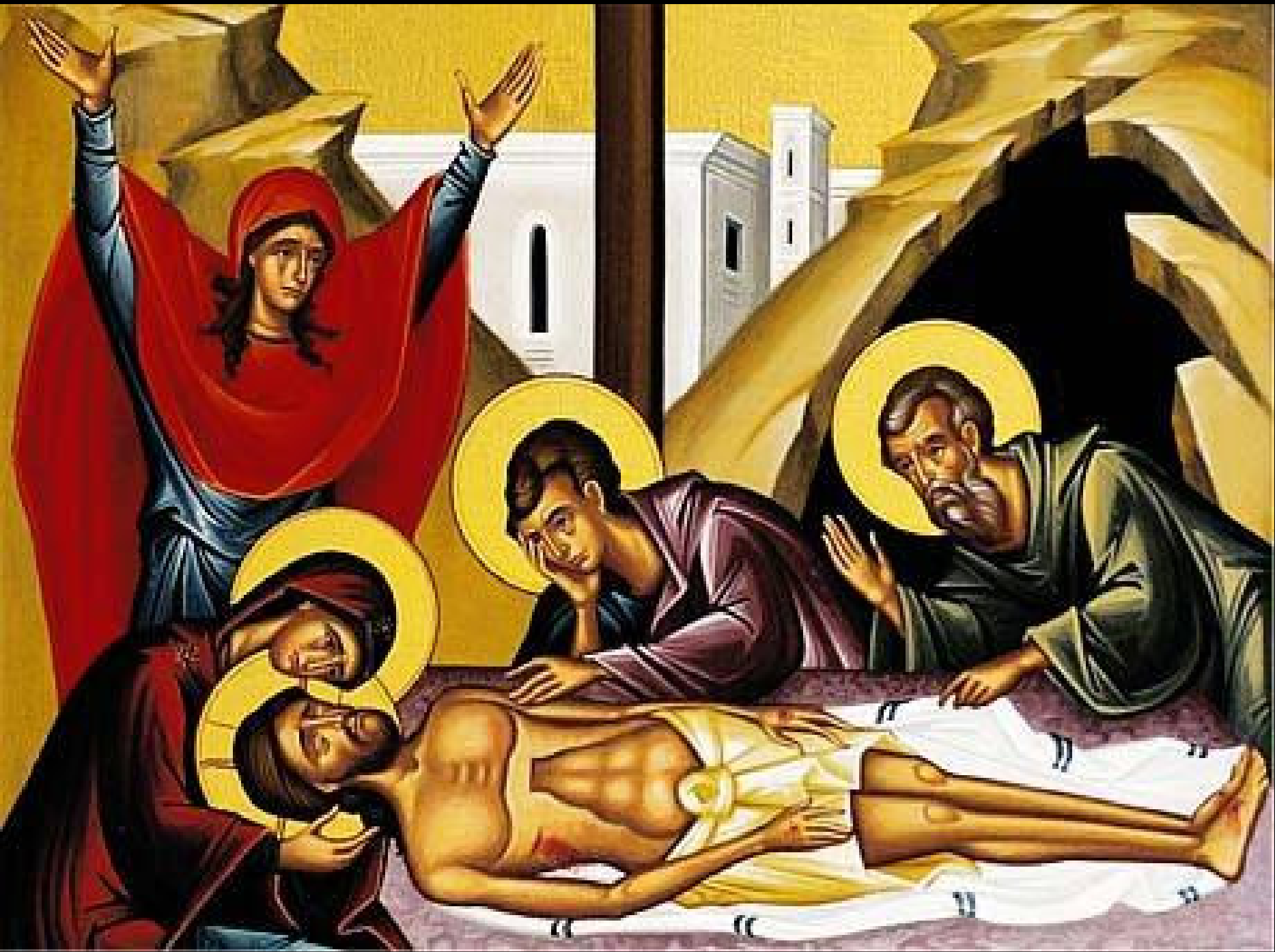

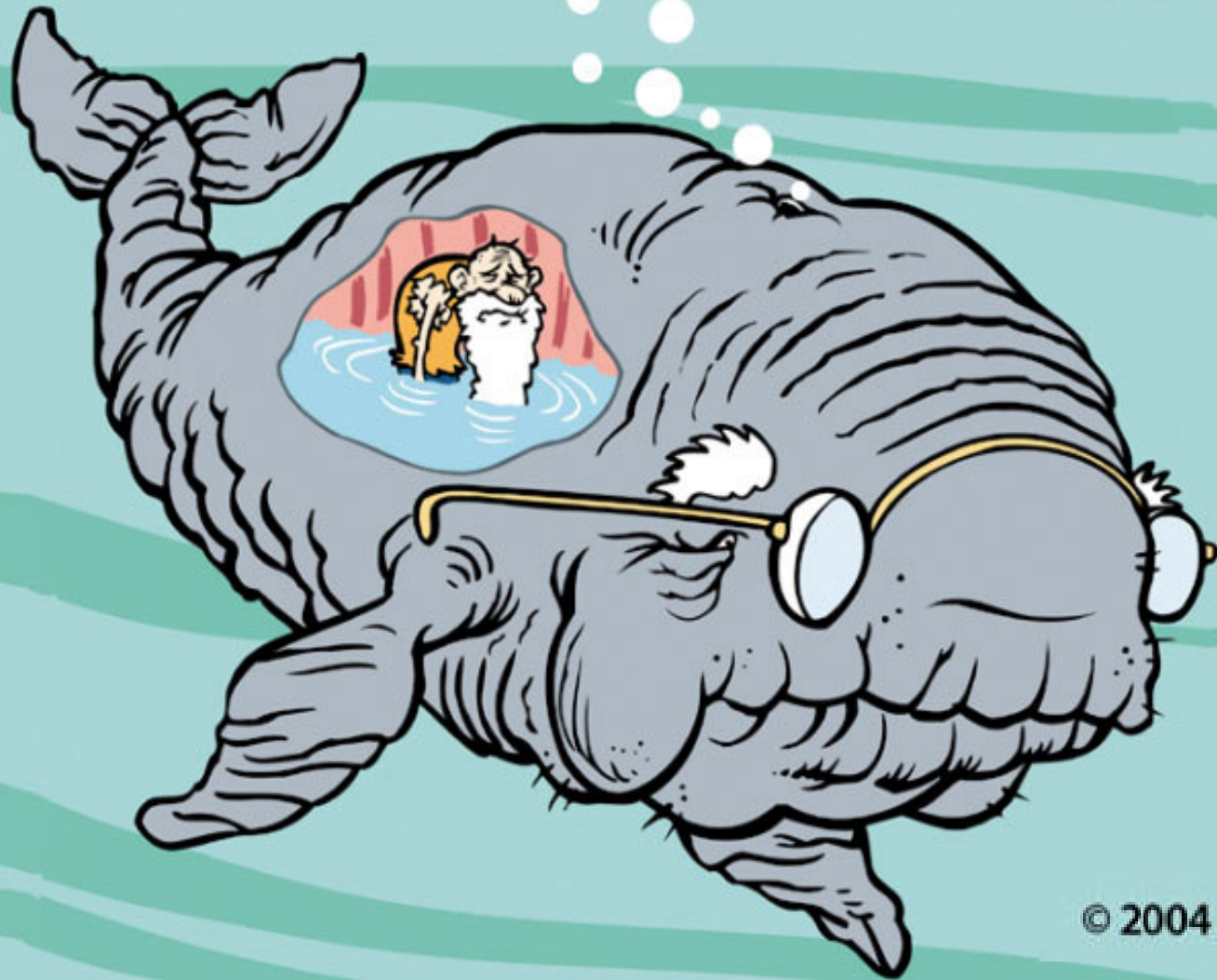

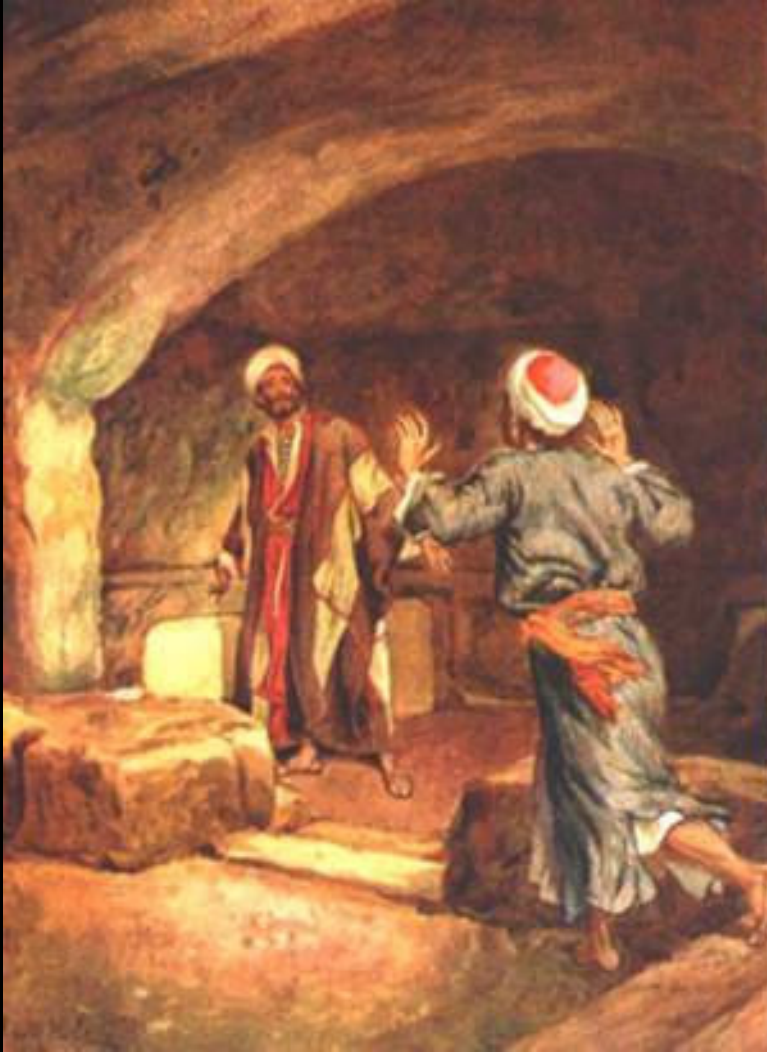
Matthew 28:2 And behold, there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven, and came and rolled back the stone from the door, and sat on it.
