1st Presentation

Natural Selection and Speciation-Having fun with Dogs and the Ice Age This is a fun talk featuring dogs that first makes the distinction between species and the "biblical kind". It then reviews what Scripture has to say about Noah's flood and the animals, each "according to its kind". Artificial selection (breeding) and then natural selection are discussed, explaining how they occur

2nd Presentation The Perfectly Providing Placenta

This very well diagrammed presentation starts with the development of the human embryo and shows how it progresses to the beginning of the development of the placenta. The remainder of the presentation focuses on the placenta itself, its subsequent development, and how it takes on the functions of supporting the life of the embryo while the placenta itself is growing and changing.
